The following terminology and data explanations should help clarify the numbers and percentages found in this report.

TERMINOLOGY

- October Count-** The number of students enrolled at a school and included in the official count sent to the Colorado Department of Education (CDE). Students attending Futures, Rebound, Children’s Hospital and Crossroads included in an APS school for October Count purposes were removed for this report.
- Total Enrolled-** Includes all students that were enrolled in school during the year. Students leaving and then returning would be counted multiple times. “No shows,” students not enrolled as of Aug. 20, 2013, are not included.
- Stable Students-** Includes all students that were enrolled on or prior to Aug. 20, 2013 and remained the entire school year without changes in enrollment or who graduated during the school year.
- Transient Students-** Includes all students that were enrolled or transferred after Aug. 20, 2013.
- Stability Rate-** Calculated by dividing the number of stable students by the summation of stable and transient students. $\left(\frac{\text{Stable Students}}{\text{Stable Students} + \text{Transient Students}} \right)$
- Transiency Rate-** Calculated by dividing the number of transient students by the summation of stable and transient students. $\left(\frac{\text{Transient Students}}{\text{Stable Students} + \text{Transient Students}} \right)$

$$\text{Stability Rate} + \text{Transiency Rate} = 100\%$$

DATA

The information used in the 2013-14 K-12 Stability and Transiency (Mobility) Report was downloaded from Infinite Campus on July 9, 2014. The data includes Kindergarten through 12th grade students enrolled in a traditional APS program. Preschool students were not included in this report. “No shows” were not included in the student totals. Students enrolled in July and August needed to remain through Aug. 20, 2013 in order to be counted. Students graduating throughout the year were included as stable students provided they started school on or prior to Aug. 20, 2013. Futures, Rebound, Children’s Hospital and Crossroads were not included in this report.
